Text format and content requirements

About Hierarchy Title

(All levels of subheadings and their sequence codes are represented by "1", "1.1", "1.1.1". The serial numbers in the main text that are not arranged according to the subheadings should be represented by "a", "b", "c", "d", etc.)

About Figures and Tables

(Place the caption at the bottom of the figure, such as “Fig.1 Accounting boundary of carbon footprint of silk products”

Place the caption at the top of the table, such as “Tab.2 Fabric specification parameters”)

Conclusion

(The conclusion should be divided into 3-5 viewpoints, summarizing the innovative content of the paper, concluding what problems the research results illustrate, what regularities have been drawn, and what theoretical or practical problems have been solved, pointing out the shortcomings or remaining issues of this study, and future suggestions.)
